### Impact of Sports Funding – April 21 – March 22

### The Sports Funding provided the following.

- Detailed breakdown of all skills to be taught, through every year group. Children were assessed through each unit and tracking was trialed throughout the school
- Detailed report on every individual child's PE progress through our assessment data.
  Yearly report to parents. (End of school year)
- Providing all pupils throughout the school opportunities to compete in a variety of sports and intra-house competitions. Giving the opportunity for more able children to develop their talents fully.

- Opportunity to KS2 pupils to compete in a variety of competitions within the community and the 'Rainbow Schools' termly competitions, when restrictions were lifted after Covid.
- The continuation of the school football team. They were entered into the 'Gedling Football League', and training was provided on a weekly basis, when Covid restrictions were lifted
- Developed the skills and confidence of Teaching staff with teaching PE and TA's and Midday supervisors with supporting children through games at lunchtimes
- Swimming observers put in place, with DBS checked Midday's, this was also inline with Covid guidelines of keeping within bubbles at the start of the academic year.
- Charity donation towards a new 'Trim Trail' in memory of a pupil, who sadly passed away.
