# **Science Day**

Last Thursday the whole school took part in a fun packed Science Day. Every child took part in scientific investigations and experiments. The learning for all children was amazing and a variety of adults observed that the children were extremely excited and motivated. Activities included: making and testing hovercraft from balloons, CDs and bottle tops; investigating the best way to make catapults; using a zipwire to test the impact of gravity on stuffed toys; using chemical reactions to create CO2 to put out a candle; experiments with water displacement and static electricity; liquid density investigation and using a candle to create a vacuum; investigating the strength of eggs by standing on them; making lentils dance in vinegar and helicopters fly at different speeds and investigations with shadows and skittles making rainbows in water.
